

Lenten guidelines: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of universal fast and abstinence.

Fasting is obligatory for all who have completed their 18th year until the beginning of their 60th year. Fasting allows a person to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may be taken, not to equal one full meal.

Abstinence (from meat) is obligatory for all who have completed their 14th year of age.

If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the “paschal fast” to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus and to prepare to share more fully and celebrate more readily his Resurrection.

Fridays in Lent are obligatory days of abstinence (from meat) for all who have completed their 14th year. As always, anyone for whom fasting or abstinence would pose a health risk is excused.

Stations of the Cross, according to the method of **St. Alphonsus Liguori**: every Lenten Friday after the 8am and 6pm Masses.

•

Tuesdays of Lent: prayers in Honor of the **Holy Face of Our Lord Jesus Christ: every Tuesday after the 6pm Mass.**

Devotion to the Holy Face was revealed by Our Lord to Sr. Marie of St. Peter (1816-1848) a Carmelite nun of Tours in France. The primary purpose of the devotion is to make reparation for sins against the first three commandments: denial of God, Blasphemy, and the profanation of Sundays and Holy Days. The devotion was eventually approved by Pope Leo XIII in 1885 who established the devotion as an Archconfraternity in the Church.

40-Hour Adoration begins on March 5th (Thursday before First Friday) at 6pm and continues through First Saturday, March 7th at 10am.

The 40-Hour Devotion or *Quarant'Ore* is a special forty-hour period of continuous prayer made before the Blessed Sacrament in solemn exposition.
