



Lenten guidelines: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of universal fast and abstinence.

Fasting is obligatory for all who have completed their 18th year until the beginning of their 60th year. Fasting allows a person to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may be taken, not to equal one full meal.

Abstinence (from meat) is obligatory for all who have completed their 14th year of age.

If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the “paschal fast” to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus and to prepare to share more fully and celebrate more readily his Resurrection.

Fridays in Lent are obligatory days of abstinence (from meat) for all who have completed their 14th year. As always, anyone for whom fasting or abstinence would pose a health risk is excused.

Fridays of Lent: Stations of the Cross, according to the method of **St. Alphonsus Liguori**: after the 8am and 6pm Masses.

Tuesdays of Lent: prayers in Honor of the **Holy Face of Our Lord Jesus Christ: after the 6pm Mass.**

Devotion to the Holy Face was revealed by Our Lord to Sr. Marie of St. Peter (1816-1848) a Carmelite nun of Tours in France. The primary purpose of the devotion is to make reparation for sins against the first three commandments: denial of God, Blasphemy, and the profanation of Sundays and Holy Days. The devotion was eventually approved by Pope Leo XIII in 1885 who established the devotion as an Archconfraternity in the Church.

40-Hour Adoration begins on March 5th (Thursday before First Friday) at 6pm and continues through First Saturday, March 7th at 10am.

Lord in the Blessed Sacrament.

The 40-Hour Devotion or *Quarant'Ore* is a special forty-hour period of continuous prayer made before the Blessed Sacrament in solemn exposition. The Blessed Sacrament remains in a monstrance on the altar for forty hours while the faithful gather for personal or public prayer in adoration of our Lord.

Consecration of the Family under the protection of the Holy Family: at the St. Joseph's Table on March 21st and at Masses on the weekend of March 22nd.

In this prayer, we ask for the aid and intercession of the perfect son Jesus Christ, Mary the perfect mother, and Joseph who is a model for every father. Through this consecration, each participant is consciously choosing to be a beacon of God's love through His Church.

How to Prepare:

The word consecration literally means “association with the sacred”, and as such it requires a much larger commitment than simply reciting a prayer off of a card. To receive the full benefit of intercession from the Holy Family, one must cleanse the body, mind and soul.

Three suggested steps before praying the Consecration to the Holy Family:

—Discuss the importance of this consecration as a family and why you are doing it. You and your family are consciously choosing to be a beacon of light of God's love through his Church.

—It is strongly encouraged to receive the sacrament of reconciliation prior to the consecration.

—As a family, intentionally choose something to fast from for the week leading up to the consecration. Fasting helps to discipline our minds and hearts to refrain from secular activities and be more focused on God.
